WEST SIDE TRANSITION ACADEMY

The UAS Academy offers speech-language therapy, socialemotional learning, community-based internships and opportunities to explore the city using public transit. UAS also helps connect job-ready students to work in competitive employment. At the UAS Life Lab, around the corner from the Academy, students develop skills of daily living in a fullyfurnished townhome.





GROWING SOLUTIONS FARM



Students attend our nationally-recognized 1.2-acre Growing Solutions Farm to learn about urban agriculture while developing transferrable job skills. The farm sells its produce at two weekly farm stands, offers a CSA subscription, and gives back to the community by donating 20% of the harvest to food pantries on the West Side, where many of our students live. The farm is also home to our sensory garden filled with plants that have a heightened appeal to the senses and where visitors can go to unwind and explore the plants at their own pace.
